

North End Arts Centre invites public to make art

A new arts facility created for youth as part of Winnipeg's Cultural Capital year is inviting the public to come by and try making some art.

The North End Arts Centre, a community program at 472 Selkirk Ave. founded by Ndinawemaaganag Endaawaad and the Cultural Capital project, will host an open house on Nov. 30 from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.

The community art studio provides North End youth with artistic instruction and a safe place to engage in creative expression. Visitors to the open house can meet some participants and choose between painting or moccasin-making as an activity.

The North End Arts Centre was proposed as part of the successful application made by the Winnipeg Arts Council to the federal government to be chosen as a Cultural Capital for 2010. Ndinawemaaganag Endaawaad has been developing programming there since April.
